



Tyler Diep is running for the 72nd Assembly District – an open seat due to the current Assembly Member running for higher office.

Tyler was first elected to the Westminster City Council in 2008 and served until 2012. After a two-year hiatus, voters overwhelmingly returned him to City Hall in 2014. Tyler now serves as Westminster's Vice Mayor.

Tyler is also an elected Director of the Midway City Sanitary District (MCSD), a special district that oversees sewage treatment and trash collection in Westminster and Midway City.

In addition to Tyler's elected positions, he works full time as an Outreach Service Specialist for the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration. In this role, Tyler works daily with small businesses and job creators across Orange County to help them cut through the red tape and bureaucracy of the IRS, Franchise Tax Board and Employment Development Department.

Tyler began his public service in 2005, working for the California State Assembly assisting Orange County residents with state-related services. He also possesses a background in broadcasting. His experience includes working as a news anchor/reporter for a television station in Fountain Valley and two radio programs in Westminster.

As a proud homeowner, Tyler recognizes the importance of keeping our neighborhoods safe and clean and has prioritized hiring more police officers and street repair while on the City Council. In the Assembly, Tyler will focus on fighting attempts to raise taxes, fixing our state's crumbling highway and water infrastructure and improving education.

Tyler earned his Bachelor's Degree in Public Administration from California State University, San Diego. In 2012, the California State Senate issued a Resolution of Recognition in honor of Tyler's service to the people of Westminster.
